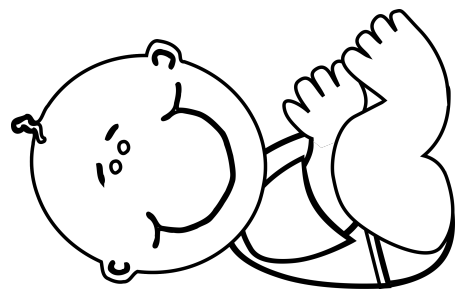
Class 8: Baby Show- Babies age Newborn to 2 Years

Each competitor will be expected to give a brief oral answer in the impromptu segment. The competition will be **limited to five contestants** and the judges' decision is final. Each contestant should obtain a \$50 Sponsor for the event. The Sponsor will escort the contestant on stage and will be promoted throughout the program. 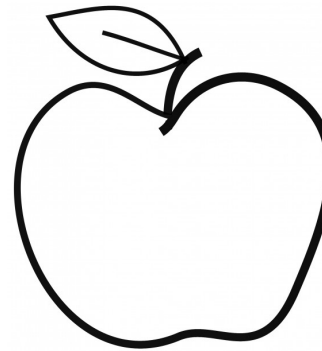

Centrepiece- A design to be viewed from all sides

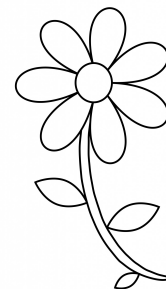

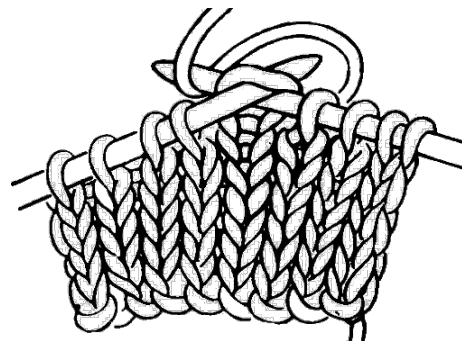
