Are you recognized as a leader in your community? Do you want to partake in something totally different and fun? The Milverton Fair Ambassador Competition is a leadership program for males and females ages 17-23. It is a one-of-a-kind experience that gives contestants the opportunity to further develop leadership, public speaking and interview skills while meeting new people and getting more involved in the community. The winner will be the recipient of a \$350 bursary upon successful completion of his or her duties. Those interested in learning more about the program should contact Becca.

Rules for the Ambassador of the Fair Competition are as follows:

Competitors must be between the ages of 17 and 23 (must turn 18 on or before August 1, 2020). Competitors must reside in the Township of Perth East or in Elma Ward in the Municipality of North Perth, or have been a Milverton Fair exhibitor in the previous two years. Each competitor is to create a Display Board (36x 48") about themselves to be viewed by all and enter at least one item into the Fall Expo, any class. A panel of judges will interview each competitor (approx. 10 minutes). Each competitor must prepare a short speech (3 to 5 minutes) on a topic of his or her choice related to agriculture, the environment or agricultural fairs. Each competitor will be expected to give a brief oral answer in the impromptu segment. The competition will be limited to 5 contestants and the judges' decision is final. Each contestant should obtain a \$50 sponsor for the event. The sponsor will escort the contestant on stage. Contestants unable to locate a sponsor should speak to the committee for assistance.

Class 12: Flowers

All plants entered should be in good condition, with damaged or old leaves and old blooms removed. Flowering plants should be in bloom for judging. All plants and flowers should be grown by and belong to the exhibitor. An exhibitor may enter only one entry in each section of each class. Buds showing colour are considered blooms. Open bottom pots must be contained. Potted plants must be grown in pots, not dug from the garden.

Definitions:

Spray - A portion of a plant with a number of flowers e.g.: chrysanthemum or petunia.

Stem - A single stem carrying one or more flowers and/or buds and greenery e.g.: snapdragon

All cakes to be on cardboard covered with foil, no more than 1" larger than item. Tarts - no commercial fillings, no store bought crusts. Hint - temper tinfoil plates (10 minutes @ 400° F before using). An exhibitor may only enter one entry per section in each class. All exhibits to be covered in plastic wrap.

Tarts must not contain fruit or nuts. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name and address using the entry tag provided. Prize money to be paid by the District.

Provincial Competition:

Entrant must be the winner from the District Competition. If the winner is unable to send an entry, then the 2nd place District winner will be eligible to enter. The size of the tarts must be full size (no mini or bite size tarts). A total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. Tarts must not contain fruit or nuts. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name and address and district representing using the entry tag provided. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place entries will not be returned to exhibitors but will be placed for auction at the convention. Provincial prize money: 1-\$50, 2-\$30, 3-\$20 donated by Gay Lea Foods Co-Operative.

QUILT COMPETITION

Hand Quilted General Conditions

- A. Quilts must solely be made and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. ALL 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement.
- C. Must have 3 layers (top, batting and back) and be quilted through all layers. Not mounted on a frame.
- D. Quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.
- E. The winner's name and pattern to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- F. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- G. Upon making an entry into the OAAS Hand-Quilted Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- H. The winning OAAS Hand-Quilted Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Provincial competition.
- I. It is the quilter's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of their quilt pattern based on copyright rules.

Local Fair Competition

1. Each local fair is entitled to send only the Grand Champion Quilt, (min. 324" measured on the perimeter) judged the best of show of all Hand-Quilted Quilts to the District Competition. OR
If any entry wins Grand Champion or Best of Show of all eligible Hand-Quilted Quilts at more than one Fair, the other Fairs at which this quilt was entered and won, should enter their Reserve Champion or Second Best of Show of eligible Hand Quilts in the District Competition.
NOTE: If an Exhibitor wins Grand Champion or Best of Show of all eligible Hand-Quilted Quilt classes at more than one Fair, the Exhibitor must consider their own Agricultural Society as the one from which the quilt will be sent to the District meeting, otherwise it should be sent from the Agricultural Society nearest his/her home address.
 2. An Exhibitor who wins more than one Best of Show title with a different Hand-Quilted Quilt at different Fairs shall be entitled to enter each winning quilt to compete at the District Competition.
 3. If an Exhibitor is exhibiting in more than 1 District, they are entitled to enter different winning quilts at different District Competitions but cannot enter the same quilt at more than one District Competition
 4. Local Homecraft Divisions are requested to judge a Grand Champion or Best of Show of all eligible hand quilts. As well as Reserve Grand Champion or SECOND Best of Show of all eligible Hand-Quilted Quilts.
- The Grand Champion and the Reserve Grand Champion are judged from all first and second prize eligible Hand-Quilted Quilts.

Machine-Quilted Competition General Conditions

- A. Quilt must solely be made, and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Quilt to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. ALL 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement
- C. Must have 3 layers (top, batting and back) and be quilted through all layers. Not mounted on a frame.
- D. Quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.
- E. The winner's name and pattern to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- F. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Machine-Quilted quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- G. Upon making entry into the OAAS Machine Quilting Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- H. The winning OAAS Machine-Quilted Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Provincial competition.
- I. Quilt must have visible machine quilting.
- J. The use of short arm and/or long arm (hand or computer guided) equipment is permitted on machine quilt entries.
- K. It is the quilter's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of their quilt pattern based on copyright rules.

Local Fair Competition

1. Each local fair is entitled to send only one Grand Champion Machine-Quilted Quilt, (min. 324" measured on the perimeter) judged the best of show, of all Machine-Quilted Quilts to the District Competition. OR
If any entry wins Grand Champion or Best of Show of all eligible Machine-Quilted Quilts at more than one Fair, the other Fairs at which this item was entered and won, should enter their Reserve Champion or Second Best of Show of eligible Machine-Quilted quilts in the District Competition.
NOTE: If an Exhibitor wins Grand Champion or Best of Show of all eligible Machine-Quilted at more than one Fair, the Exhibitor must consider their own Agricultural Society as the one from which the Quilt will be sent to the District competition, otherwise it should be sent from the Agricultural nearest his/her home address.
 2. An Exhibitor who wins more than one Best of Show title with a different Machine-Quilted Quilt at different Fairs shall be entitled to enter each winning Quilt to compete at the District Competition
 3. If an Exhibitor is exhibiting in more than 1 District, they are entitled to enter different winning quilts at different District Competitions but cannot enter the same quilt at more than one District Competition.
 4. Local Homecraft Divisions are requested to judge a Grand Champion or Best of Show of all eligible Machine- Quilted Quilt as well as a Reserve Champion or Second Best of Show of eligible Machine-Quilted Quilt.
- The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion are judged from all first and second prize eligible Machine-Quilted Quilts.
