How to Enter the Milverton Fair Classes 1 to 25!

The Milverton Fair has an important role in our community as a place to display and feature our skills and accomplishments! The classes are designed to illustrate a high quality of workmanship and encourage creativity and originality!

Volunteers will be available to receive entries on **Thursday, September 17 from 6-8 pm and on Friday, September 18 from 9 am to Noon at the Milverton Agri Centre (MAC) 17 Pierson St. Milverton, ON**

Exhibits will be on display until 3 pm on Saturday, Sept 19, 2026. Exhibitors are required to pick up their items and prize money between 3-4 pm.

A \$5 annual membership is required (for any age) to enter in Classes #12-25. This fee will be retained from any prior year prize money earned. All other classes are free to enter (age requirements do apply). Prize Money awarded as follows:

Classes #1 to #3 – as marked

Classes #4 to #25: 1st - **\$5**, 2nd - **\$4**, 3rd - **\$3**

Specials (as marked): 1st - **\$10**, 2nd - **\$8**, 3rd - **\$6**.

Complete a Milverton Fair Entry Form (list all entries in order of class number) These forms are available online or at the Perth East Public Library and must be signed by the exhibitor.

Complete entry tags ahead of time. Entry tags are available at the Perth East Public Library

All exhibitors (except for Junior Fair Classes 4-11) must obtain an exhibitor's number from the Milverton Agricultural Society (MAS) and complete an entry form. No person shall be allowed to enter more than one item in one section of any class.

Entry tags must be attached to the respective articles entered. After judging is completed, these entry tags will be opened and name and address will be shown during the Fair. It is fine to use preprinted information such as address labels.

All grains, vegetables, plants, provisions, fancy work, etc. must have been produced or made by the exhibitor, in the present year on his or her property or holding. The item must not have been entered at the Milverton Fair before.

No laundered or worn garment will be awarded a prize. Safety pins only to be used, NO STRAIGHT PINS. The Directors shall have the power to withhold a prize if the judge reports an article unworthy of a prize, and there is no compensation.

This new special is being added in memory of Ann Hargrave who passed away in November 2025 and who was a long-serving secretary at the Milverton Agricultural Society. Ann loved to make brownies so her husband Robert Hargrave, 2013 OAAS President, is sponsoring this class in her honour.

The following recipe will make one 9" x 13" pan of Annie's delicious brownies. Brownies made the old-fashioned way; mixed by hand and with a hand crank egg beater. For judging, please plate five brownies (1"x1" square) on a paper plate & cover with clear wrap.

Annie's Brownies Ingredients:

½ Cup Butter

¼ Cup Cocoa-Fryer's Premium

4 Eggs (room temperature)

2 Cups White granulated Sugar

1½ Cups Flour (Robin Hood all purpose)

Directions:

Sift dry ingredients and beat eggs,

In a sauce pan, melt butter then add sifted Fryer's Cocoa stir until blended,

In a large bowl, beat eggs until very frothy, add sifted sugar and flour, pour Fryer cocoa butter mixture in bowl, commence stirring all ingredients until thoroughly mixed.

Pour batter in a greased 9" x 13" (ceramic or glass pan)

Bake at 350F for 30 minutes until cooked when the edges are pulling away from the side of the pan.

Annie's Brownie Icing Ingredients:

1⅓ Cups icing sugar

⅓ Cups of Cocoa-Fryer's Premium

3 Tbsp butter

5 tsp hot water

Directions:

Sift dry ingredients.

Stir ingredients together for at least 2-3 minutes, add hot water as required, then spread over 9" x 13" pan of baked brownies.

22. Butter Tarts – 6 tarts on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag. Tarts must be full size tarts. (no mini or bite size tarts) and must not contain fruit or nuts (ie. no raisins, no pecans). Entry including the pastry must be made solely by the exhibitor.
23. Maple syrup: exhibit shall consist of one (1) curved Kent style glass bottle (D&G #505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle), of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A - Amber, having a capacity of 250 ml.
24. Liquid Honey: exhibit shall consist of one (1) clear glass container, having a capacity of 500 grams (375 ml).

OAAS ANNUAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT COMPETITIONS

Eligibility, Rules and Regulations. HAND and MACHINE quilts must have a total perimeter measurement of 280" minimum, square or rectangular (smaller quilts do not qualify). HAND and MACHINE quilts must be solely made by the Exhibitor, exhibited and judged at a local fair to be eligible for this competition. Judging will occur at local fairs and District Competition held October this year. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention, Toronto in February next year. Upon making an entry in the OAAS Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor, by saying YES on their entry tag, agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition. The winning OAAS Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention OAAS competitions. Winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on a sign provided by OAAS.
