## **Rules and Regulations**

## PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

All exhibitors must obtain an exhibitors number from the MAS and complete an entry form to receive a payout.

Fruit, and Roots & Vegetable produce must be from the exhibitor's garden/property. Exhibitors shall, if required by the Directors, make a statutory declaration that the articles exhibited by them are exhibited in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Society. Our Directors will take every precaution to secure the safety of articles sent to our fair. However, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting. Should any article be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, the Directors will assist in recovery, but not make any payment for the value thereof. The Directors reserve the right to change any classes at any time during the fair. The Directors shall have the power to withhold a prize if the judge reports an article unworthy of a prize, and there is no compensation. Only one entry per person per section of a class will be allowed. Where prizes awarded equal or exceed \$5.00, the 2026 membership fee will automatically be deducted from the prize money.

### Class 9: Fruit

Displayed on a sturdy disposable plate unless otherwise stated, with entry tag stapled to plate.

All plants entered should be in good condition, with damaged or old leaves and old blooms removed. Flowering plants should be in bloom for judging. Buds showing colour are considered blooms. Open bottom pots must be contained. Potted plants must be

grown in pots, not dug from the garden.

All exhibits to be covered in plastic wrap, or clear bagged.

#### OAAS ANNUAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT COMPETITIONS

Eligibility, Rules and Regulations. HAND and MACHINE quilts must have a total perimeter measurement of 324" minimum, square or rectangular (smaller quilts do not qualify). HAND and MACHINE quilts must be solely made by the Exhibitor, exhibited and judged at a local fair to be eligible for this competition. Judging will occur at local fairs and District Competition held October this year. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention, Toronto in February next year. Upon making an entry in the OAAS Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor, by saying YES on their entry tag, agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition. The winning OAAS Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention OAAS competitions. Winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on a sign provided by O.A.A.S.
